

T.I.M.E. Mentoring

Our Transforming Integration into Meaningful Experiences (T.I.M.E.) lived experience mentoring program fully launched! T.I.M.E. mentors service both in the community and in Juvenile Hall. We look forward to expanding this in 2023.



Community Building

H.I.R.E. provided quarterly subcommittee meetings for employment, juvenile reentry, women's reentry and advocacy topics, hosted in partnership with local organizations. An all-community meeting on Fentanyl was hosted, in addition to a documentary screening of Belly of the Beast, and numerous speaking engagements at conferences and local universities.

Staff also participated in OC CAP Alliance, OC Recovery Collaborative, Community Corrections Partnership/AB109, Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council and Prop 47 Local Advisory Committee meetings.

Over 400 new members were added to our network.





Reentry Resource Fair

In June, we hosted the countywide Re-Entry Resource Fair at the Honda Center in Anaheim, California. Over 300 people attended, benefitting from over 50 vendors representing employers, service providers and county agencies. Participants received free haircuts and phones and were able to win gift cards and work and school supplies.

The event attracted the OC Register and Vikki Vargas with NBC 4 News to highlight our event.

Youth Job Fair

Two weeks after the Reentry Resource Fair, H.I.R.E. co-hosted the county's first Youth Job Fair in partnership with Project Youth OC in Santa Ana. The event provided food boxes, clothing, food, toys, and hygiene supplies to over 150 families. Youth and families in attendance were able to connect with service providers, get health screenings and apply for jobs. Everyone in attendance was entered to win a variety of school supplies, sporting goods, gift cards and other donated goods.

The Future is Working Giving Day


H.I.R.E. partnered with 15 other local nonprofits and the Orange County Community Foundation to host The Future is Working, a 24-hour collaborative Giving Day to generate support to get under resourced populations back to work.

Thanks to our generous matching partners Medlin Workforce & Reentry Solutions, Diseño Architects and KBC Painting, H.I.R.E. almost doubled our original goal, raising \$19,386 with an astounding 191 donors – more than double any other participating organization. These funds helped H.I.R.E. provide employment assistance and resource referrals to system impacted people in our community. In total, 623 donors raised \$317,277 for the campaign.

Funding

Funding from our foundation, corporate and community providers supported two part-time staff for the full year and the ability to provide programs and services.


